Dr. Maja Manoleva was born on 22.05.1972, in Skopje, where she finished primary education in the Primary School "Lazo Trpovski", and secondary education in the Medical School Center "Dr. Panche Karagjovov" Skopje, in 1991. In 1997 she graduated from the Faculty of Medicine in Skopje within the University "Ss. Cyril and Methodius". In 2011 she completed the specialization in physical medicine and rehabilitation at the Department of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation within the Faculty of Medicine at the University "Ss. Cyril and Methodius" in Skopje. Since 2013, she has been employed as a specialist in physical medicine and rehabilitation at the Institute of

Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, where in August 2017 she was appointed Acting Medical Director of the Institute. In 2015 she enrolled in third cycle doctoral studies at the University "Ss. Cyril and Methodius" in Skopje, study program - clinical medicine. As a specialist doctor, she has been actively involved in solving general professional problems in the field of physical medicine and rehabilitation. She is a member of the Medical Chamber of the Republic of Macedonia, the Macedonian Medical Association, and the Association of Doctors of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation of the Republic of Macedonia, where she holds the position of Secretary of the Association, and she is also a member of the European Society of Physical and Rehabilitation Medicine (ESPRM).

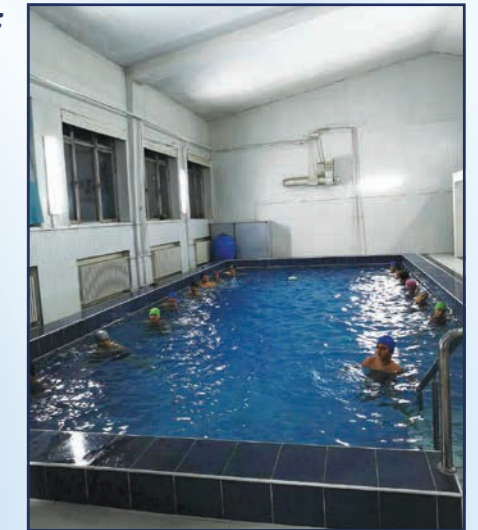


The PHI Institute of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation - Skopje was established on 08.02.1956, and it has been situated in its current premises since 1963. Ever since its existence, a high level of healthcare activity has been achieved in the domain of physical medicine and rehabilitation, which strives to follow the achievements in the EU countries. In parallel with the development of the staff and the supply of equipment, the scientific thought of the Institute has been growing as well. Numerous scientific and expert presentations have been held by healthcare workers in the Institute of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation. In 1988, the Department of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation within the Faculty of Medicine in Skopje was established, in the specializations of doctors in the field of physical medicine and rehabilitation.



The organizational and spatial structure of the Institute is as follows:

- ◆ Department for Diseases of the Musculoskeletal System in Men with a Section for Special Conditions for Stay
- ◆ Department for Diseases of the Musculoskeletal System in Women
- ◆ Department for Administrative-Legal Affairs and Human Resources
- ◆ Department for Material Financial Operations, Accounting and Public Procurements



Medical rehabilitation is a continuous process by means of which functional capacity of patients is achieved, in accordance with the remaining abilities, their readaptation and their resocialization. A Commission for assessment of the specific needs of persons with physical or psychological developmental disabilities up to 26 years of age also operates within the Institute. The development strategy of the PHI Institute of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation - Skopje will always be in line with the modern tendency for a healthcare reform that will refer to high-quality policy of hospital admissions, hospital treatment, improvement of standards in treatment, improvement of conditions in a hospital department, and promotion of the educational and scientific-research activity in the field of physical medicine and rehabilitation.



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
